2025 CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

YEAR 1—TERM 2

ENGLISH

Students are reading and viewing a range of traditional tales. They are learning about story structure, characters, setting, and key events, and will retell a traditional tale in their own words using a storyboard with sentences and pictures.

Students will also share their personal opinions, describe their favourite characters, and make connections to their own experiences. This helps build their comprehension, storytelling, and writing skills in fun and creative ways.

MATHEMATICS

Students are learning to break apart one- and two-digit numbers in different ways, including into tens and ones. They are also solving everyday problems using addition, subtraction, sharing, and grouping with numbers up to 20, using different strategies to help them work it out.

SCIENCE

Students are exploring how light and sound help us to see and hear. They are investigating how light travels, how shadows are formed, and how different materials affect light. They are also learning how sound is made and how it travels through different objects and materials. Through hands-on experiments and observations, students are developing their understanding of how we use light and sound in our everyday lives.

TECHNOLOGY

Students will apply what they learned in Science and Design Technologies to design and make a boat that floats. Building on their understanding of materials and their properties, students will explore how different materials can be used to create effective solutions. Their final project will be to design, build, and test a floating boat as part of their culminating assessment.

THE ARTS

Students will be studying Media Arts. Using the elements of media, students will explore how photographic portraits represent families and how technology can manipulate images in media artworks. They will also communicate about where and why media artworks are made, and the importance of copyright.

Health: My Safety, My Responsibilities

Students will identify how emotional responses impact on others' feelings. They will also develop an understanding of how to stay safe in the wider community, what are safe and unsafe situations, for example sun safe strategies. They will learn to promote their own health, safety and wellbeing while keeping themselves and others healthy, safe and physically active.

PE: ATHLETICS

Students will perform and refine fundamental movement skills, for example, jumping, running, and throwing. They will use these skills to solve various movement challenges. They will apply strategies for working cooperatively and safely while participating in ball games and athletic events.

HASS (Humanities & Social Sciences)

Students will identify and describe important dates and events in their own lives. They will explore how daily life has changed over time while recognizing aspects that have stayed the same.

Students will ask and respond to questions about the past and different places by gathering and interpreting information from observations and provided sources. They will practice putting personal and family events in order.

Students will use everyday words related to time (such as "yesterday," "long ago," and "before") to tell stories about the past and describe how things have changed over time.
