

2025 CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

YEAR 2—TERM 2

ENGLISH

We are learning to listen carefully to others and join in conversations. We are practising telling stories and sharing our own ideas. We are learning how to give our opinion and explain our thinking by using what we know. We are also learning how to organise our ideas and use special words and voice features to make our speaking clear and interesting.



MATHEMATICS

In Maths, we are learning how to break apart, rearrange and rename two- and three-digit numbers by using what we know about place value. We are practising using maths strategies to solve addition problems, including problems with money. We are also learning how to work out how many days there are between events using a calendar, and how to read the time on an analogue clock to the hour, half past, and quarter past and quarter to.



SCIENCE

In Science, we are learning to talk about how objects can change. We are asking and answering questions about what we see and think will happen. We are using informal objects to measure and compare what we observe. We are also practising how to record and show what we find out.



HASS (Humanities & Social Sciences)

We are learning to talk about special places in our community and explain why they matter to people. We know the world is made up of different places, and we can describe them in different ways. We are also learning how people from different places are connected, and what helps make those connections. As we explore, we are asking questions, making careful observations, and finding useful information. We are learning to understand different points of view and draw simple conclusions from what we find. We show our information in tables, and we reflect on what we've learned so we can think of ways to care for important places.



TECHNOLOGY

Students will discover how a working farm meets everyday needs by exploring its' key technologies and designing simple practical solutions for on-farm challenges. They will use labelled sketches to record their solutions. Finally, they will plan steps required to turn fresh produce into

THE ARTS

Students will be studying Media Arts. Using the elements of media, students will explore how photographic portraits represent families and how technology can manipulate images in media artworks. They will also communicate about where and why media artworks are made, and the importance of copyright.

HPE

PE: ATHLETICS

Students will perform and refine fundamental movement skills, for example, jumping, running, and throwing. They will use these skills to solve various movement challenges. They will apply strategies for working cooperatively and safely while participating in ball games and athletic events.

Health: My Safety, My Responsibilities

Students will identify how emotional responses impact on others' feelings. They will also develop an understanding of how to stay safe in the wider community, what are safe and unsafe situations, for example sun safe strategies. They will learn to promote their own health, safety and wellbeing while keeping themselves and others healthy, safe and physically active.
